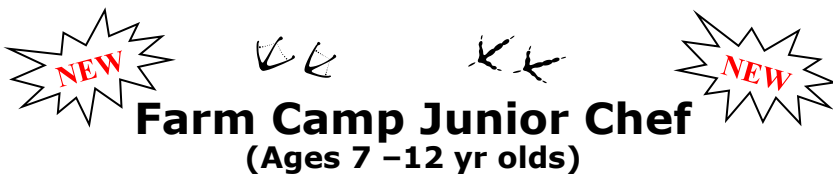
**A Summer Experience Not to Be

## Down on the Farm ( Age 5–12 yrs old)

During the week, campers explore our animals, gardens and fields through a variety of activities, games and crafts. It is an ideal week for those who enjoy getting their hands in the dirt! Highlight: caring for your own “adopted” animal”. The week culminates as families join campers for a parade of animals which they have worked with during the week. III July 1 - 5 ( Reserved for campers ages 5 & 6 yrs)\*\*\*



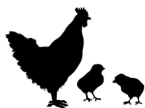
